Example: The non-discounted rate is \$0.10924/kWh, the discounted rate is \$0.09271/kWh and the kWh used in the billing period is 683. Full price bill of \$74.61 (\$0.10924 X 683) less Discounted bill of \$63.32 (\$0.09271 X 683) equals a Discount of \$11.29 (\$74.61 - 63.32).
